



# Three in the Middle

## Song Origin:

## Dance Moves:

In the first verse, those in the middle are trying to escape the middle, and those in the circle are trying to keep the middle people in. There is a twirl on “Oh my Lilly oh”.

In the second verse, players show with their fingers the number of people in the middle, and then the number of people who escaped the middle with a turn on “Oh my Lilly oh” again.

During the third verse the person(s) in the middle approaches a member of the circle, twirls them, and pulls them into the middle, if there is only one person in the middle have them twirl at least two people in.
